The purpose of the trip is to enjoy curling, to improve their physical health and to foster a positive attitude towards daily physical activity. Students must take their school indoor shoes to be worn at the curling rink. Curling equipment is being provided by the Vegreville Curling Club for our use, but if students wish to bring their own curling equipment they most certainly can. There is an element of risk in every athletic activity or field trip. The safety and well-being of students is a prime concern and attempts are made to manage foreseeable risks inherent in physical activity by taking appropriate precautions. However, due to the very nature of some activities, the risk of injury may increase. Injuries may range from minor sprains and strains to injuries more serious in nature. Students will be on an ice surface with no protective head gear. As well, students are walking with a supervisor and will be crossing several streets to get to the curling rink. Please discuss behavior expectations with your child. Students will be required to follow all applicable school rules for this extra-curricular trip. Failure to do so will result in a referral to the administration of the school.

There is NO fee for this recreational curling activity.
